Please note... Our Sunday morning Religious Education session for 2009-2010, will be open to students in Grade K-6 only. Youth Ministry

Arise Announcement

Renew International began in 1978 in the Archdiocese of Newark , NJ as the first Catholic organization to develop a diocesan-wide, parish spiritual renewal and evangelization process. The process, named RENEW, was aimed at revitalizing parish life in light of Vatican II. This process has spread throughout many dioceses in the United States and Canada. In response to an invitation by Cardinal Sean O'Malley, RENEW has developed a program specifically for the Archdiocese of Boston called *ARISE Together in Christ*.

The Goals of the ARISE process

The path of spiritual renewal laid out by the ARISE process begins with a period of formation for archdiocesan and parish leaders. The process then guides the participants through five distinct periods of time (called Seasons). Each Season engages the entire parish in a developmental progression of gospel themes namely:

Season One	Fall	Encountering Christ Today	(completed Fall 2008)
Season Two	Lent	Change Our Hearts	(completed Lent 2009)
Season Three	Fall	In the Footsteps of Christ	St. Margaret Mary will begin with Season Three in the Fall 2009.
Season Four	Lent	New Heart New Spirit	
Season Five	Fall	We Are the Good News	

Since the program has already been implemented in many parishes of the Archdiocese of Boston beginning in the Fall of 2008, RENEW has advised that parishes beginning the process in the Fall of 2009 do so by starting with Season Three. Therefore, St. Margaret Mary Parish will begin the *Arise, Together in Christ* process in the Fall 2009. RENEW provides comprehensive training for the parish planning team and small community leaders.

How will the parishioners experience the weekly themes?

Parishioners experience these weekly themes in several ways, primarily:

Small faith-sharing communities whose members meet in homes and other locations throughout the parish during the course of the week(s).

Sunday Mass where the theme of the week is included in the homily and the prayers of the faithful

Family and individual prayer network

What is the role of the parish priest in the ARISE process?

This process works under the spiritual leadership of the pastor. In collaboration with the pastor, the practical implementation of the ARISE process is carried out by parishioners who are well trained in their roles.

How does the ARISE process relate to justice?

The ARISE process works under the spiritual standards of Christ to all areas of life. It emphasizes people living in good relationship with one another as they make concrete applications of the gospel to their life situations. The ARISE process challenges people not only to be of service to the poor and needy, but also to address the underlying causes of injustice.
