From Fr. Chris (*note - I shared this with my sister before putting it in the bulletin*):

While I may never experience the blessing of being a father in the real sense of the word, I have been a “birth partner.” When my sister, Anne Marie, a single mother, was pregnant with my niece Molly, she asked me to be present with her when the time came for Molly to be born. Negotiations followed. I was to be a “coach” not a “catcher,” if you know what mean. There was to be a modesty screen and I was to sit up at her head doing all the things that the “coach” does. I thought it just involved me telling her to “breath” and “push,” that all I would do is show up on the day that Molly decided to be born and that would be that. Then my sister handed me a pamphlet and sprang on me the fact that I would have to attend six evening classes on the “birthing process” and how to “co-partner” in this “wonderful journey of new life” or so the pamphlet said. At the time, my days and evenings were pretty full as I was serving as director of communications and spokesperson for the archdiocese which often involved being in the newspaper or on television or the radio. But I said okay. I managed to make five out of the six sessions (my mother filled in for me at the other one). I learned more about how babies are born then I ever wanted to know. I watched at least three of those videos on babies being born that leaving nothing to the imagination (aside: I can’t imagine ever allowing myself to be filmed like that but maybe that’s just me). I learned how to massage my “partner’s” shoulders and arms and hands (my sister loved this). We had some wonderful directed meditations when the lights would be dimmed, electric candles were lit (no open flames in hospitals) and we were encouraged to imagine ourselves being born like coming forth from the inside of a rose as it opens up (I had a lot of fun with this one on the ride home – I still have a bruise on my arm where my sister hit me as she laughed and told me I was a big jerk). But the highlight was when on the last night, the instructor kept looking at me sideways until she came over at the break and said, “Did I see you somewhere today?” I had been all over the news because some story was breaking about something to do with the crisis so I said, “Perhaps, you saw me on the news?” Her eyes lit up with recognition and then puzzlement. Up to this point my sister and I had never said anything other than we were Anne Marie and Chris Coyne. I guess she assumed that we were husband and wife. I was really tempted to not say a word and let her think whatever she would but after a pause I said, “My sister is a single parent and I am supporting her as the birth coach.” She walked away with a bemused smile on her face and we went back to our massaging.

Well, in spite of all these classes, Molly’s birth was a bit more complicated than hoped and my sister had a c-section. I was devastated. What about all my coaching? What about all the massages and “breath” and “push” and “you’re doing great”? Why the h\*\*\* did I have to attend those classes???? I wanted to offer to be a coach for

someone else. I was ready. Sadly, it was not to be. At the end of the day, I was allowed in the operating room (all dressed up like Dr. Kildare) to be with my sister and calm her anxiety and worry as Molly was born. Still, it had its moments. I never realized before that a c-section involved as much bouncing up and down. I really couldn’t see what going on because “Curtain #1” was up and was I trying to keep Anne Marie calm as most of her body was being treated like a one of those bouncing tents you rent for kids parties. Finally, we heard the wail of new-born baby girl and Molly was born. In a minute, they were able to bring her over to my sister who was gushing tears all over the place with relief and joy and gratitude. The nurse said to me, “Why don’t we take the baby over to the side and check her out while they finish with your wife.” I let that one go. However, when we were counting Molly’s toes and fingers and measuring and weighing her, Molly opened her eyes and looked up at me and made one of those baby grimaces that kind of looks like a smile but is probably gas. The nurse turned to me and nicely said, “She has your eyes” at which point I smiled and laughingly said, “I don’t think so. I’m the brother and Anne Marie’s my sister and we ain’t hillbillies.” It took her a second to figure it out but she, too, had a good laugh as she said, “Well, she still has your eyes.” She wrapped Molly up again, handed her to me, and I brought her back over to Anne Marie at which point Molly did what all babies do, all over my arm. I said to my sister, “Molly just baptized my arm.” My sister could only respond “amen.”

So, I’ve never been a father, but I guess you could say, I’ve come real close. You know, when people ask me about being celibate they often say what a sacrifice it must be to not have a spouse or be a father. But I watch my siblings and other parents and I see the sacrifices they make every day for their children. Once these wonderful creatures enter their lives as a gift from God, their life is not their own anymore. Parents often work long hours to provide for their children, sometimes with a great deal of travel away from the family. They have to be so patient. When my nieces and nephews are having a meltdown, I can walk away. They can’t. Parents worry, they comfort, they love. They sacrifice themselves for their kids and it never really ends. Even when the children are older and away, they are still their kids and if asked, they would do anything for them.

So, on this Father’s Day weekend, let us remember all that our fathers (and mothers) have done and do for us. Let us remember all of the sacrifices they made for us, big and small. Let us pray that those who have died may rest in the peace of heaven and let us pray for all parents as they live out their ministry of love. And let us give thanks to God the Father for all he has done and continues to do as well.

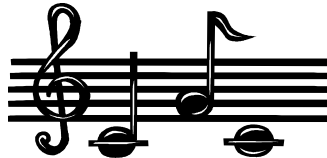

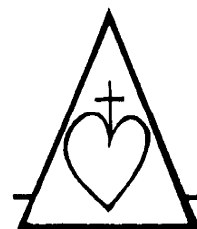

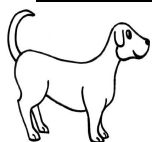

By the way, 2009 First Communion & Confirmation are also there. **Please note...** Our Sunday morning Religious Education session for 2009-2010, will be open to students in Grade K-6 only. Due to the number of students wishing to participate in our Sunday morning Rel. Ed. Program, all Grade 7 & 8 students will meet on Monday evenings, every other week, 6:30-8 p.m.

**2009-2010** Sunday morning Rel Ed. classes and weekday Gr. 1-6 classes will be filled on a first come, first serve basis.

**Students entering Grades 2 & 10** as well as students new to our program, will not be assigned to classes unless a copy of his/her baptism certificate accompanies the complete 2009-2010 Rel. Ed. registration form if not baptized here at St. Margaret Mary Parish.

**Come, sail away...** The Office for the New Evangelization of Youth and Young Adults (part of the Archdiocese of Boston) is once again hosting their annual harbor cruises for our YOUTH. The ships set sail from Commonwealth Pier, Boston and will have onboard hundreds of other Catholic YOUTH. Dozens of our YOUTH went last year and danced the night away (or ate the night away)! Come and bring a friend! (Adults will be needed to chaperone, not dance!)

**High School Harbor Cruise** sets sail July 27 (8-11 p.m.) and costs \$30. We'll leave St. Margaret Mary Parish at 6 p.m. and return around 12 midnight.
